We noticed inconsistences with parents understanding of what we as a service ask of you and what you are ok with your Educator using in regards to images of your child. We have now created a secondary photography approval form which applies directly to your Educator. We have strengthened our position in regard to children on social media and this Service and its Educator's will not be posting identifiable features of children (faces etc.) as we respect their right to privacy under the United Nations Conventions Rights of a child Article 16.

Any Visitors or Students are also not permitted to take any photos of children in care
